Enclosed is your application for the Weatherization Program

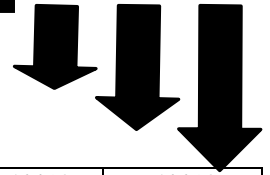
To be eligible for the program, your income for the previous 12 months cannot exceed 100% of median income for your family size. See box at right for 200% poverty & 100% median income limits for different size households. If your family income falls below 100%, you qualify for the program. A household is automatically income qualified if they received SSI, Low Income Heating Asst.(LIHEAP) ATAP, TANF, APA/IA, Food stamps or Sr. Benefits.

If your home has received weatherization services or participated in the Home Energy Rebate Program after April 2008 you are not eligible.

Application Process & What to Expect

1. We determine the household priority that applies to your situation. Priority definitions established by AHFC are listed in the box to the right. The weatherization guidelines require that Interior Weatherization serve priority one clients first, then priority two, and so on as our budget allows.
2. You will need to complete an application, which will include income verification backup (taxes, W-2's, 1099's, etc.), proof of ownership or landlord/tenant agreement and energy and fuel usage. If you are automatically qualified, verification will also be required.

The complete application will place you on a wait list by priority/date received. When your priority gets close to being served, we will contact you to update the application and obtain your current income documentation, if necessary. We will contact you within 3 months of working on your priority category.

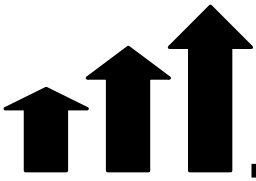

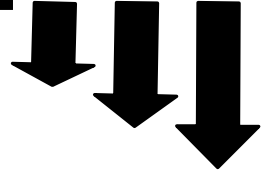

PRIORITY CATEGORIES

1. The household includes a resident who is elderly, disabled, or a child under 6 years old, **and** the total household unit income is less than or equal to 200% Poverty Income.
2. The household includes a child who is 6-18 years old, **and** the total household unit income is less than or equal to 200% Poverty Income.
3. Other households with total household unit income that is less than or equal to 200% Poverty Income.
- 4a. The household includes a resident who is elderly, disabled, or a child under 6 years old, the total household unit income is less than or equal to 200% Poverty Income **and** the house has been previously weatherized.
- 4b. The household includes a child who is 6-18 years old, the total household unit income is less than or equal to 200% Poverty Income **and** the house has been previously weatherized.
- 4c. Other households with total household unit income less than or equal to 200% Poverty Income **and** the house has been previously weatherized.
5. The household includes a resident who is elderly, disabled, or a child under 6 years old, and the total household income is over 200% of poverty and under 100% of median income.
6. The household includes a child who is 6-18 yrs. old and the total household income is over 200% of poverty and under 100% of median income.
7. Other households with total household income that is over 200% of poverty and under 100% of median income.



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STANDARD WEATHERIZATION PROCEDURES

Step 1-Complete Application

- When your application is complete, you will receive a letter from us indicating if you are eligible for the program. A letter of non-eligibility will indicate why you are not eligible and your rights to appeal if you choose too.
- Once eligible, you will be placed on the appropriate priority list. Depending on the priority category the household qualifies for, time on the waitlist can be lengthy (lower priorities could be years depending on number of families applying).

Step 2-Attend Weatherization Workshop

- Clients must attend a 2-hour weatherization workshop prior to having an assessment completed on the dwelling. Workshops are regularly scheduled and appointments are not necessary to take the workshop. If for any reason you have difficulty attending (waivers are available for special circumstances), please contact the client intake specialist at 452-5323 x 0.

Step 3-Home Assessment

- You will be contacted to schedule an assessment in order of your priority rank. After completing the testing and visual inspection of your home, a determination will be made on the weatherization measures to be completed on your dwelling.

Step 4-Weatherization Work

- When your weatherization measures have been determined, your materials will be ordered and our in-house crew and/or contractor will be scheduled to complete the job.

Step 5-Final Inspection

- After all work is finished a final inspection of your home will be done to assure all work was completed in a quality and professional manner.
